3 Hotel Le Pavillon Des Lettres

A modern and stylish design hotel, the Pavillon des Lettres is themed around great writers. There are no numbers on the rooms, rather they are assigned letters that correspond to the name of a writer. Hence S is for Shakespeare, R for Rousseau, and so on. The location of the hotel puts you across the street from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and just around the corner from the Elysée, where the French President lives and works. In other words, it's a very safe neighborhood. Older children or teen-agers will undoubtedly be thrilled with being so close to the Champs-Élysées, too, where they can spend hours shopping, sitting at the cafés or just people watching. And one of Paris's best pubs is just downstairs and across the street, so when the need for a hamburger and a coke arises, the kids can easily get their fix.
