Ownership	Le Pavillon des Lettres is privately owned by the Chevalier family, who also own Pavillon de la Reine, Place des Vosges and Hotel du Petit Moulin, Rue du Poitou

Location	In the 8 <sup>th</sup> arrondissement, just a street away from Rue Faubourg Saint Honoré – ideal for shopping and the British Embassy
Overview	<p>Le Pavillon des Lettres is a small luxury boutique hotel based on a novel concept: each of its 26 rooms represents a letter of the alphabet and is dedicated to a writer - B for Baudelaire, S for Shakespeare...</p> <p>The hotel has sweeping views of the Eiffel Tower and the Grand Palais, especially from the top floor rooms.</p>
Access	A 45 minute drive from Roissy Charles de Gaulle International Airport and a short walk from the Champs Elysees. 20 minutes from the Gare du Nord for Eurostar.
History	The hotel was bought by the Chevalier family in 2008 and was a 3 star 32 bedrooms hotel. It was closed in August 2009 and has been transformed into a small luxury 4 star boutique hotel
Interiors	Designed by Didier Benderli, who was responsible for the interiors at Pavillon de la Reine, the hotel is very French, elegant and modern. Lines from a poem, play or text are an integral part of the design in every room – transcribed above the bed.
Accommodation	There are 26 rooms and suites- one for each letter of the alphabet: Hans Christian <b>A</b> ndersen, Charles <b>B</b> audelaire, Pedro <b>C</b> alderón de la Barca, Denis <b>D</b> iderot, <b>E</b> schyle (Aeschylus), Gustave <b>F</b> laubert, Johann Wolfgang <b>G</b> oethe, Victor <b>H</b> ugo, Henrik <b>I</b> bsen, Henry <b>J</b> ames, Franz <b>K</b> afka, Jean de <b>L</b> a Fontaine, Alfred de <b>M</b> usset, Gérard de <b>N</b> erval, <b>O</b> vid, Marcel <b>P</b> roust, José María de Eca de <b>Q</b> ueiroz, Jean-Jacques <b>R</b> ousseau, William <b>S</b> hakespeare, Leo <b>T</b> olstoy, Honoré d'Urfé, <b>V</b> oltaire, Virginia <b>W</b> oolf, <b>X</b> enophon, William Butler <b>Y</b> eats, Émile <b>Z</b> ola.
